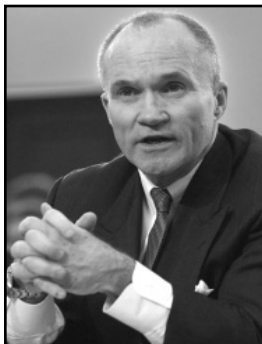

2010 GRAND MARSHAL
THE HONORABLE RAYMOND W. KELLY
Police Commissioner, City of New York



A 40-year veteran of the NYPD, Commissioner Kelly served in 25 different commands before being appointed Police Commissioner by Mayor David N. Dinkins in 1992. Raymond Kelly was reappointed Police Commissioner of the City of New York by Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg in January 2002, making him the first Police Commissioner to hold the post for a second, separate tenure. Under Commissioner Kelly's leadership, the NYPD became the first municipal police department in the country to create its own counterterrorism bureau and global intelligence program. He is responsible for driving down crime by nearly 40 percent in New York City during his tenure as Commissioner.

Commissioner Kelly is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps and served three years on active duty, including a combat tour in Vietnam. He is a retired Colonel from the Marine Corps Reserves with 30 years of service.

Ray Kelly is a former senior managing director of global corporate security at Bear Stearns. Before that, he served as Commissioner of the U.S. Customs Service, where he managed the agency's 20,000 employees and \$20 billion in annual revenue. For his accomplishments at the U.S. Customs Service, Commissioner Kelly was awarded the Alexander Hamilton Medal for Exceptional Service. From 1996 to 1998, Commissioner Kelly was Under Secretary for Enforcement at the U.S. Treasury Department. There he supervised the department's enforcement bureaus, including the U.S. Customs Service; the U.S. Secret Service; the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms; and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center.

In addition, Commissioner Kelly served on the executive committee and was elected Vice President for the Americas of Interpol, the international police organization, from 1996 to 2000. He also served as Director of the International Police Monitors in Haiti, a U.S.-led force responsible for ending human rights abuses and establishing an interim police force there. For this service, Commissioner Kelly was awarded the Exceptionally Meritorious Service Commendation by the President of the United States. In 2006 Commissioner Kelly was awarded the French government's highest honor, the Légion d'Honneur.

Commissioner Kelly graduated Archbishop Molloy High School and holds a BBA from Manhattan College, a JD from St. John's University School of Law, an LLM from New York University Graduate School of Law, and an MPA from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. He has been awarded honorary degrees from Marist College, Manhattan College, the College of St. Rose, Quinnipiac College, St. Thomas Aquinas College, Iona College, New York University, St. John's University, Pace University, the Catholic University of America, and the State University of New York.

Raymond Kelly traces his Irish heritage to the West of Ireland in the counties of Roscommon, Cavan and Longford.

JAMES MICHAEL BARNES

Knights of St. Patrick Aide to the Grand Marshal

James Michael Barnes was born in Bayside, Queens, and attended Mount St. Michael High School in the Bronx, and Marist College. James served as a U.S. Marine Corp Lieutenant and combat platoon commander in Viet Nam. He has relocated over 700 businesses in and out of NYC, and directed the relocation of the Fulton Fish Market to the Bronx for the City of New York. He published "How to Move Your Company and Not Get Fired." James serves on the board of the Adaptive Sorts Foundation/Wounded Warriors Project, the Marine Corps League, the NY Athletic Club Rugby Alumni, the Colony Theater Foundation for Youth, a director of Marist College (since 1986) and Mount St Michael High School. He runs weekends of sports for the wounded warriors from Walter Reed Hospital in Windham and Breezy Point. James is a member of the Knights of St. Patrick, and he and his wife, Maryellen have five children and 13 grandchildren.

MATTHEW DEVINE

New York County Aide to the Grand Marshal

Matthew Devine, born in Brooklyn, was the first son of the late Mildred Devine and Matthew W. Schafer. His father, a Silver Star recipient, died in World War II, and his mother remarried the late Michael Devine, who raised Matthew in Garden City Park, Long Island. Matthew was educated at Holy Spirit grammar school in New Hyde Park and attended high school at Monsignor McClancy Memorial in Jackson Heights, Queens. He graduated with an AAS Degree from Nassau Community College and has a Bachelor of Business Administration from Adelphi University. Matthew retired in 2006, after a long career in the retail industry as planner, merchandise controller and buyer. He is an active member of the A.O.H. and Vice President of Division 2, New York County. He is a lifetime member of the 210 Footwear Foundations, and a charter member of the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian. Matthew is a parishioner and an usher at St. Nicholas parish in Jersey City and traces his ancestry to the counties of Roscommon and Cork.

JOHN W. HYLAND

Bronx County Aide to the Grand Marshal

John W. Hyland was born and raised in Manhattan and is the proud son of Ellen and Joseph Hyland. John is a retired NYC Auxiliary Police Sergeant and he received numerous awards, letters of personal recognition, and commendations, including the Award of Valor, the highest honor a NYC Auxiliary Police Officer can receive. John is president of the Board of the NYC Auxiliary Police Benevolent Association for the past 35 years. John was employed with Verizon Communications for 33 years and is still a proud member of Local 1101 Communications Workers of America. John is an active Hibernian, and served in every elected office in the Daniel J. Quilty Division 7 in Bronx County. John served as the recording secretary, vice president and president for the Bronx County Board and two separate terms as State Director of District 4, and Deputy Catholic Action chairman for the State A.O.H. John was a member of St. John's Parish, Kingsbridge, for over 50 years and is now an active member of St. Lawrence O'Toole in Brewster.

CATHERINE McCARTHY

Queens County Aide to the Grand Marshal

Catherine McCarthy (nee Lynch) was born in Crean, Co. Limerick, and attended Monegea School, New Castle West. In 1950 she immigrated to New York, where she worked for the New York Telephone Company. She is married to Jim McCarthy since 1956 and they have had six children: Kevin, MaryAnn (deceased), James, Joe, John and Joan and 13 grandchildren. He is a member of the St. Patrick's Society of Brooklyn, Celts of the Brooklyn Courts, Notre Dame Club of Staten Island, Judge Advocate, and American Legion of Richmond County & Livingston Post. He is a member of the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 421, Catholic War Vets, VFW, AM VETS, and was the Grand Marshal of both the Staten Island St. Patrick's Day Parade and the Brooklyn Courts St. Patrick's Day Parade in 1998 and 2002, respectively. He is the founder of the All Kazoo Marching Band, S.I. and is a member of the Waren Jaques Memorial Committee, Winged Fist Advisory Board and Association of Veterans of Canada, U.S. Chapter, and past President S.I. MICHAEL BYRNE

Nassau County Aide to the Grand Marshal

MALACHY McALLISTER

United Irish Counties Aide to the Grand Marshal

Malachy McAllister was born in the Markets area of South Belfast to Robert and Ellen McAllister, the second oldest of six boys and two girls. Malachy played Gaelic football with St. Paul's GAC in West Belfast, and became a well-known athlete and Division One handball player. Malachy started work as a bricklayer in 1974, after his life was threatened by Loyalist youth outside his original place of employment. Malachy served nearly four years in the H-Blocks of Long Kesh alongside other Republican POWs for his part in an attack on British Security Forces. Malachy and his family fled Ireland for Canada in 1988 as a result of threats on their lives. There he became recognized as one of the top Canadian stonemasons for his work on the historical restoration of St. Patrick's Church in Guelph, Ontario, and The Queens Park Parliament Building in Toronto. The McAllister family applied for political asylum in the USA in 1996 and his struggle to provide and protect his family from deportation continues to this day. Malachy has received enormous amount of support throughout America from elected officials and Irish-American organizations, in his continued struggle to live in this country. He married his childhood sweetheart, Bernadette, in 1988 and they had three boys and one girl: Paul Gary, Mark James, Sean Ryan and Nicola. His wife, Bernadette, died of cancer in 2004.

TERRANCE McADAMS

Aide-at-Large to the Grand Marshal

Terry McAdams was born in the Bronx in 1934, and moved to Ireland when he was 4, his parents returned to the U.S. five years later. He received his education at Power Memorial Academy in New York City and Hofstra University, Long Island. He married Barbara Riggle in 1960 and they were married for 39 years at the time of her death. They were blessed with three children: Keith, Lisa and Kevin; and six grandchildren: Kenneth, Bryan, Robert, Tara, Shannon and McKerrah.

Terry worked in the airline business for 27 years, after which he started his own business that is still going strong after 33 years. In 1984, Power Memorial, which was run by the Irish Christian Brothers, closed, and Terry, believing that Power shared the New York City St. Patrick's Parade's love of Irish Faith, Heritage and Culture, worked to get the school reaffiliated as a participant in the parade. Since rejoining the parade, Power has won several awards for their performance on March 17th, something of which Terry is quite proud.

BERNARD "BUDDY" SULLIVAN

Grand Council Aide to the Grand Marshal

Bernard "Buddy" Sullivan was born and raised in the Bronx and is the eldest child of Bernard and Grace's seven children.

Buddy joined the New York City Department of Sanitation in 1981. He rose steadily through the ranks to various supervisory positions within the Bureau of Cleaning and Collection and the Bureau of Waste Disposal. In 2000, he was promoted to Chief and in seven years he served in two capacities, Chief of Bureau Operations and Chief of Cleaning Operations. In 2007, he was promoted to the rank of Director of the Bureau of Cleaning and Collection where he was responsible for the management of a \$550 million budget, supervising the Bureau's 7,650 employees, plus creating, implementing, and monitoring new cleaning and collection initiatives. In December 2009, Buddy was promoted to First Deputy Commissioner and assumed the role of directing all daily operations of the Sanitation Department, which includes the Bureau of Cleaning and Collection, the Bureau of Waste Disposal, the Enforcement Division, the Division of Safety and Training, the Personnel Management Division, and the Field Inspection and Audit Team. Buddy completed the Mayor's Leadership Institute in 1995 and attended the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University in 2005. Buddy is Past President of the DSNY Emerald Society and Vice President of the Grand Council of United Emerald Societies.
